Expand recycled wastewater supply and desalination

Who should pay for the excess capacity from the desalination project until demand materializes for its water, Cal-Am shareholders, business ratepayers, or residential ratepayers?

I support expansion of recycled wastewater supply and desalination. There are too many uncertainties to be confident of any water demand forecast. But it is predictable that additional water supplies are/will be needed for housing and the economy. New water users probably should shoulder a majority of the financial burden for additional water supplies.

GROWTH POLICIES
